***From the Pastor's Desk***

From the early stages of his public ministry, Jesus' path takes him to the place of his Death and Resurrection. On the way, he encounters those seeking compassion and healing. Today Jesus is in between Samaria and Galilee, a place where interesting things can happen.

Similarly, Naaman is out of place—a foreigner in the land of the Israelites—yet he asks the holy man, Elisha, to cure his leprosy. The reading begins just as Naaman does what Elisha has instructed: he plunges into the Jordan and is cleansed. Elisha refuses the man's offering, saying that God's mercy and love are free. Naaman returns home, taking some dirt from the land of the holy man with him; his act of gratitude is to connect the land of the holy man with his own.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is on a journey to Jerusalem. The ten lepers approach Jesus as he is entering a village. They are required to stay outside the community, but they call to Jesus, asking for healing. Jesus does indeed heal them, and Luke says he does so, not when he hears them call to him, but when he *sees* them. In the Scriptures, whenever Jesus "sees" it means that he sees deep within the person; he sees who they really are. He sees with the heart of compassion and understands where their (our) cry is coming from. This encounter with Jesus is the beginning of new life. And yet it is only the "foreigner" who seems aware of the deeper significance of the healing and returns to give thanks.

There are many in-between places and times in our lives—when we may not be sure of our true place or the life ahead of us. At those times we cry out to the Lord: "Have pity on me; take care of me; show me what I am to do." We can be sure that Jesus "sees" us, understands our "in-between" state. and wants to heal us.
